A LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear friends,

Mehrelad ateh //

What an eventful year 2022 was for many! According to the UN,100 million people were displaced as they fled conflict, violence, human rights violations, and persecution. Moreover, the World Health Organisation reports that there was a 25% increase in depression and anxiety among people. August 2022 saw the beginning of widespread protests in Iran, the greatest display of dissent in the country since the Revolution of 1979. And in response, the world watched as the regime responded with increased fear tactics – arrests, beatings, executions, heightened surveillance, internet restrictions, and military operations.

How do we encourage those, including many of our own students who were joining protests and at times taking care of prostestors, who are living in the midst of extraordinary challenges, uncertainty, and countless personal tragedies?

"Fret not yourself because of evildoers; be not envious of wrongdoers! For they will soon fade like the grass and wither like the green herb. Trust in the Lord, and do good; dwell in the land and befriend faithfulness." (Psalm 37:1-3, ESV)

In these words of Holy Scripture, we see that the Psalmist acknowledges the reality of evildoers and wrongdoing. But he goes on to declare that there will surely be a glorious end to such wickedness and the calamities it brings. Crucially, the Psalmist encourages the reader to "Trust in the Lord," "do good," "dwell in

the land" and "befriend faithfulness." The exhortation to "befriend faithfulness" can also be translated to "feed" on God's faithfulness. Feeding on God is the source of our friendship with Him. As Jesus tells us, "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me" (John 15:4). We are reminded of this when we partake of the Lord's supper, that we are eating of Him. We cannot dwell in the land without dwelling in Christ and Christ dwelling in us.

Through all that we do at Pars, our desire is to direct Iran's emerging leaders towards feeding on God and growing in faithfulness, as they trust him and do good while dwelling in the Land of Iran. Your prayers and generous support have made it possible for us to equip and mobilize a new generation of maturing servant-leaders who dwell in Christ and feed on His faithfulness. Through your support, you have stood in solidarity with these emerging leaders as they shepherd the young and beautiful church of Iran, Afghanistan, and the Persian-speaking diaspora. For this I thank you. In spite of all the hardships of 2022, the Lord's faithfulness sustains us all, and I hope this report will be an encouragement to you.

Stories from our Students Sharing Jesus' Love for Women among Protestors

In October 2022, a young woman protesting in Iran was severely beaten by security forces and collapsed on the ground. Her friends managed to drag her away from the eyes of the security officials and took her to an open apartment that was nearby. At the same time, another group of portestors who were fleeing from the violence of the security forces also took refuge in the same apartment (it had become a custom that the doors of homes were being purposely left open to take in those who were fleeing or injured during the demonstrations). The group who had taken refuge there were warmly received by the owners of the apartment. The woman who was beaten had a badly bruised leg and she was crying out in pain. The owners, a husband and wife, gave her pain-killers and treated her leg. However, the pain did not subside, indicating that the leg was possibly broken. (If injured protesters were taken to hospital they would risk being arrested as the hospitals were under the control of the Police and Revolutionary Guards).

Two of the women present in the apartment were Christian students who upon seeing how much pain this woman was in, asked if she would like for them to pray for her healing in the name of Jesus Christ. This girl responded: "Whatever calamity we face comes from religion and God, and you want to ask God to help me?"



They replied: "The God whom we are speaking about is very different from the God that you know". Her response was: "What difference does it make? All religions are the same". The rest of the young people present in the house were of the same opinion. In response, the Christian students spoke about the God of love in contrast to the God the woman had known before. They explained that the God of the gospel is one who searches for people, he is the God who wants to have a relationship with his children: he the God who became incarnate and who came to us in order that we might know him. When they said that the God of the Gospel is also the God who suffers for our sake - who shares in our pains and sympathises with us in our weaknesses - the group became curious and wondered who this strange God is that is unknown to them. That night, after the injured girl had been introduced to the true God, she accepted the offer of the Christian girls to pray for healing in the name of Christ. After the prayer, this young woman realised that her leg had been touched and warmed by the presence of God, and with much excitement she exclaimed that God had healed her. The two students then told her that he is not only a God of healing but that he desires to be the personal God of this woman and all those who were in this home.

That night the conversation continued until midnight and it was agreed that the following night after the protests, this group would again gather again and have further discussion about the message of the Gospel.

On the second night, conversation continues and the group was increasingly drawn towards the person and character of Christ, in contrast to other prophets and religous leaders they had believed in. Some asked to have a copy of the Gospel, so the Christian students promised to bring them copies of the New Testament. Then the woman who was healed asked if they could bring her a cross to put around her neck.

One of the Christian women gave the girl her own cross, and as she put it around her neck the girl started crying with joy. There were further nights of discussion concerning the meaning of freedom in the Christian faith and Jesus' love and respect for women.

These discussions have been continuing since then and these students have asked us to pray that those involved would come to faith in Christ.



School of Theology & Leadership

I. Module Development

By God's grace, in 2022 we were able to develop 1 new online modules, bringing the total of complete modules to 37, equivalent to 151 credits of our Bachelor in Theology and Leadership. This 1 module included:

The Person and Work of the Holy Spirit (5 credits)

We also continued working on the production of the following 5 other modules:

- Introduction to Pars (1 credit)
- Psalms and Wisdom Literature (4 credits)
- Preaching for Christian Ministry in Iran (4 credits)

- · Christology for Christian Life and Ministry (5 credits)






2. Online Classes & Tutoring

482 incredible students were offered 18 online modules of study, along with high quality tutoring throughout the year. 227 of our student body trained with us from Iran and the rest from Turkey and across 15 other countries to which the Iranian diaspora has spread. Modules we offered students in 2022 included the following:

3. Leadership Formation Conferences

We planned to host a total of 12 Formation Conferences in 2022; however, the widespread protests and demonstrations in Iran made travel difficult for some of our students. As a result, we had to cancel two conferences in September and October. In total, we hosted 10 Formation Conferences that gathered 204 students altogether. See below for more information:



4. Mentored Growth & Development

In 2022, 283 students were covered by our mentoring program. Of the 283 students matched with a mentor, 30 are new mentees. Moreover, we recruited and trained 4 new mentors to join our team of mentors.

5. Ministerial Practice and Reflection

In 2022, 210 students have taken part in our Ministerial Practice and Reflection Program. This is the fourth component of our School of Theology Program, through which students are required to have at least 2-3 hours of ministry every week which can be in a variety of ministries. The aim is to help students to apply what they have learned in real life and develop their ministerial skills. Another objective is to help students to make their ministerial practice a learning experience and theologically reflect on what God is doing in their lives and the lives of others. Ministries that our students are currently involved in are as follows:



Student Spotlight Kia and Negin



As missionaries with Cru, Kia and Negin run a ministry among Iranians called *Family Life Farsi*, out of Birmingham, UK. This is a ministry focused on providing training and resources for Iranian Christian families on marriage, parenting, family life, discipleship in the home and more. In October 2022, they celebrated the publication of their new Farsi resource on Marriage called "Baaham" ("Together" in Farsi). They also ran their first conference on Marriage for Iranian Christian couples in Belgium!

Student Spotlight Shadi



Shadi was a young underground house church leader in Iran before she was arrested in 2015. Upon her release from prison, Shadi was told she must leave Iran, so she moved to Turkey as a refugee in 2016. Today, as a refugee still in Turkey, Shadi leads a vibrant children's TV show broadcasted into Iran and many other countries through Mohabat TV. Through this show, Shadi disciples many young Iranian children, teaching them about all areas of their faith and thus contributing to their spiritual formation.

"I have learned so many things at Pars, but more than anything else, I have been profoundly blessed by the counselling I have received. My whole life imploded when I went to prison and then left my home country. My counsellor's gentle and caring approach to listening, teaching and modeling has led me to experience deep healing and take important steps towards inner freedom. Walking through life with this counsellor has been a transformative experience."







Pars Counselling Centre

I. Therapy

In 2022, Pars counsellors provided 2,067 hours of therapy to Iranian Christian individuals living in Iran, Türkiye, and the Persian-speaking diaspora. 310 people received counselling, and 100 clients were from inside the country. Approximately 62% of our clients are women and 38% are men. Counselling was primarily provided through online sessions or on the telephone.

2. Training

Between January and December 2022, our counsellors were able to give 71 hours of training in counselling-related topics to the Iranian Christian community worldwide. Training includes running online seminars on topics such as trauma, depression, anxiety, and abuse. The online seminars were for underground house churches in the homeland, Iranian churches in Türkiye, and across Europe. Other opportunities have included: speaking in online women's gatherings, as well as running workshops for house churches inside Iran with the necessary security precautions in place.



In 2022, we broadcasted 618 hours of our video lectures (including repeats) to the Persian-speaking world; this is a combination of 292 hours through our partnership with SAT7 and 326 hours via MOHABAT TV.

Iranians and Persian speakers. Comments

in 2022. In May, we had the highest number
of visits to Shagerd with 5,420 people
visiting our website.

Pars Academy

In 2022, we have had 94 new participants register with Pars Academy bringing the total of PA participants to 376. We also launched 3 new modules on the academy platform, including:
